*I am spending lonely days and nights here, accompanied by **Carrie (A)**. We do not know anybody here. Twice a week I visit **Berth** and **Mina (B)**. There I also see **Martha and her kids (C)**. This is our **only** distraction.*

*Saturday I visited the **Kaufmanns (D)** to congratulate them to their golden wedding anniversary. **Frida (E)** has written to them that **many Memmelsdorf relatives** have gathered at **Bertha Kaufmann's (F)**, including you.*

During your New York visit, I imagine, there was never a dull moment. One invitation was followed by the next. I would have loved to participate, believe me. Quite often I am struck by a yearning for my relatives.

But it will come as destiny decides.

*Once I visited **your sister Stein (G)** hoping to hear more about your whereabouts. But she had no news or an address of you. But she promised to contact me as soon as she hears from you; but so far no news.*

*Are you staying at **your farm** frequently? You are living in town, in **your own little house**.*

***Berthold (B)** is working at a garden nursery. **Fredi (B)** is finishing school in a few weeks, he will become a locksmith apprentice. He has grown a lot, he is also quite brave. Glad to hear that **Ruth Prager (H)** made a good choice, also that **Martha (H)** is engaged. Soon it will be **Suse's (I)** turn.*

*It would be nice if Pragers would write to me. Quite frequently I hear from **Stern (K)**, he asked for your address because he wants to write to you. He is still enjoying life. I do not recall if I gave him your address Here is his address, so you can write to him. **Siegfried Stern, 319 N Sycamore Ave, Los Angeles, California**.*

*Now my loved ones, please remember us and think about how you can help us; cordial greetings to all of you and kisses from your **old aunt Trina**.*

*Have you heard from **Nathan (L)**?*

*Well, with this letter I have responded to all the **Goldmeier**-letters.*

*Write soon, greetings to all the **farm-folks**.*
