In 1936 Simon und Martha Kahn, who lived with their son Erich in a flat on Gärtnerplatz in Munich's city center, had bought this villa as a weekend house.

Beginning in 1939 this villa served as refuge for several Kahn-relatives, who had fled from Memmelsdorf and Mühlhausen to Munich.

15-year old Erich Kahn rescued his photo-album, when he immigrated to New York in November 1939.

His Leica he had buried in the villa's garden before emigration. We received a copy of this album from Erich's children living in the US.

Besides standard sceneries in Munich the album shows many photos of Kahn-relatives.

**These are in many cases the only existing photos of some of therelatives who could not escape Germany and who did not survive.**
